<b>Summary:</b>	The papers of printmaker Grace Albee measure 4.5 linear feet and date from 1890 to 1971. Found are biographical material, correspondence, twenty diaries, printed material, photographs, and artwork, including one sketchbook.

The collection received a preliminary level of arrangement after donation and was microfilmed onto reels 2845-2847 and 2977-2978. In 2020, the collection was processed, and a finding aid prepared by Jayna Josefson with funding provided by the Collections Care Initiative Fund, administered by the Smithsonian American Women's History Initiative and the National Collections Program.

## Terms of Use

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## Biographical / Historical

Grace Albee (1890-1985) was a printmaker and wood engraver active in Rhode Island and New York City, New York. Albee's prints were largely inspired by her surroundings while living in New York City, Paris, and rural Rhode Island.

Grace Thurston Arnold was born in 1890 in North Scituate, Rhode Island. During high school, she began weekend classes at the Rhode Island School of Design and enrolled as a student in 1910 where she studied painting, drawing, and printmaking. During her career, Grace concentrated on printmaking with woodcuts and lithographs.

In 1913, Grace married muralist Percy Albee and they raised five sons. The Albees moved to Paris, France in the 1930s where she held her first one-woman show. Later, they lived in New York City, Pennsylvania, and Rhode Island, locations which would inspire her throughout her artistic career. She produced prints into her nineties and died in 1985 in Rhode Island.

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## Scope and Contents

The papers of printmaker Grace Albee measure 4.5 linear feet and date from 1890 to 1971. Found are biographical material, correspondence, twenty diaries, printed material, photographs, and artwork, including one sketchbook.

Biographical materials include biographical sketches and family history records. Correspondence is with family, friends and institutions and includes letters from Percy Albee, John Taylor Arms, Ralph Fabri, and A. Hyatt Mayor. Twenty diaries and a fragment date from 1927-1970 and may include information on specific prints and daily activities. Artwork consists of prints by Albee, pencil sketches, and unsigned works.

## Series 3: Diaries, 1927-1970

### 1.2 Linear feet (Boxes 2-3)

Scope and Contents: Twenty diaries date from 1934 to 1970; one fragment consists of a few pages from April 1927. Diaries 1 and 2 are five-year diaries and are sporadically used. Diaries 3-20 vary between calendar style diaries and daily diaries. These may contain detailed notes of each day's activities, sketches, and wood engravings created and worked.

## Series 5: Photographic Material, 1910-1971

0.5 Linear feet (Box 4-5, OV6)

Scope and Contents: Albee family photographs include portraits of Grace and Percy Albee; snapshots of Albee with her children and family; photos of homes; photos of Albee at work carving woodblocks; wedding photos of family members; and photos of events, dinners, and gatherings, including a neoclassical themed event held at the Rhode Island School of Design in 1921 and at the Salmagundi Club. Also found are photographs of works of art by Grace and Percy Albee.

## Series 6: Artwork and Artifacts, circa 1910s-1960s

### 0.2 Linear feet (Box 5)

Scope and Contents: Artworks by Grace Albee include a sketchbook kept during her time in Europe, specifically Germany and France; a book composed of loose wood engravings and accompanying pencil drawings; and a proof of her design for a Lucky Strike cigarette advertisement. Also found are unsigned works by others including an unfinished watercolor scene of figures dressed in military uniform.
