Merle Baasch (1914-1995) was a painter and composer active in Long Island, New York, who painted landscapes inspired by her surroundings in Bayport and Sayville, New York.

Scope and Contents:

Biographical materials include identification cards and invitations and a home movie recording showing Baasch's studio in winter. Correspondence is from family, friends, institutions, and arts organizations. Photographs depict Baasch, Baasch in her studio, and artwork. Printed materials consist of clippings, newsletters, and exhibition announcements and catalogs, many of which are hand drawn. Writings including lists of works of art, poems, and a notebook. Also found are sketches taken from a sketchbook.
