Summary:	The Truman Howe Bartlett scrapbook dates from circa 1865-circa 1914 and measures 0.6 linear feet. The scrapbook contains photographs, correspondence, clippings, and printed material, most likely assembled and heavily annotated by Bartlett, documenting his career as a sculptor and teacher as well as his travels in Europe, in particular, Italy. A small portion of the scrapbook concerns the career of Bartlett's son, sculptor Paul Wayland Bartlett.

Biographical / Historical

Truman Howe Bartlett (1835-1923) was a sculptor and educator active in Connecticut and Boston, Massachusetts. He was the father of sculptor Paul Wayland Bartlett.

Born in Dorset, Vermont, Bartlett studied under Robert Eberhard Launitz in New York City before traveling to Paris, Rome, and Perugia to continue his education abroad. He taught in the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's architecture department for over 22 years, operated a free art school for children in Boston, and ran the only Boston school for sculpture in the late 1800s.

Bartlett's best known works include *The Wounded Drummer Boy of Shiloh*, and the *Horace Wells Monument* (1875) in Bushnell Park, Hartford, Connecticut.

Scope and Contents

The Truman Howe Bartlett scrapbook dates from circa 1865-circa 1914 and measures 0.6 linear feet. The scrapbook contains photographs, correspondence, clippings, and printed material, most likely assembled and heavily annotated by Bartlett, documenting his career as a sculptor and teacher as well as his travels in Europe, in particular, Italy. A small portion of the scrapbook concerns the career of Bartlett's son, sculptor Paul Wayland Bartlett. Additional news clippings mounted on scrapbook pages which were housed with the scrapbook but are unrelated to Bartlett and his career as an artist, are of columns on "Household Knowledge" and "Popular Science" from the same unidentified source. It is unclear whether these pages were found with the other scrapbook. They are accompanied by a cover and 1 page with annotations similar to those in the main scrapbook and a photograph of an individual who could be Bartlett.

Due to the small size of this collection the scrapbook(s) are arranged as one series.
