Scope and Correspondence is with John Hill Morgan, discussing the authentication and purchase of eighteenth century American historic engravings and portraits; correspondence with Henry F. du Pont relating to collecting American portraits and naval scenes; correspondence with Josiah K. Lilly, regarding collecting portraits of English and American literary and political figures; and correspondence with David K. E. Bruce, and others. One October 1953 letter is from Albert Deane of Paramount International Films in New York, concerning a possible Gilbert Stuart miniature.
