# **Biographical / Historical**

German-born Los Angeles painter and educator Bettina Brendel studied at Kunstschule Schmilimsky, Hamburg, and Landeshochschule Für Bildende Künste, Hamburg with Erich Hartmann in the 1940s before coming to the United States in 1951. She continued her studies at the University of Southern California from 1955-1958, and taught at the University of California, Los Angeles, from 1958-1961.

Brendel's work can be found in the collections of the San Francisco Museum of Art, Pasadena Art Museum, and Long Beach Museum of Art amongst others.

The papers of painter and educator Bettina Brendel measure 0.7 linear feet and date from 1937 to 2000. Found are biographical materials, correspondence, a writing, photographs, printed material, and a mixed media scrapbook.

Found are scattered biographical materials, correspondence, writings about Brendel by others, photographs, printed material, and a mixed media scrapbook.

Correspondence is with Dr. John Marburger of the State University of New York at Stoney Brook. Also found is an article by Marburger about Brendel's paintings. Photographs are of Brendel, her studio, her home, and of works of art. Printed materials include exhibition announcements and catalogs. A mixed media scrapbook includes mementos of Brendel's career in Germany and the United States and exhibitions and includes scattered letters and photographs.
