Louis Bunce (1907-1983) was a painter, printmaker, educator, and mural painter in Portland, Oregon.

An interview of Louis Bunce conducted 1965 October 29, by Dorothy Bestor, for the Archives of American Art.

Scope and Contents

Bunce speaks of his early art training; WPA mural projects he was involved in; the Northwest art scene in the 1930s; his WPA colleagues; how subject matter was selected for the murals; public perception of the project; the dispersal of the work produced by the Federal Art Project; leaving the Northwest, going to New York and getting on the mural project there; and the project's impact on the careers of artists.
