Biographical / Historical

Cleveland, Ohio ceramicist, glass artist, and educator Edris Eckhardt (1905-1998) was known for her work for the Works Progress Administration's Federal Art Project (WPA FAP), and her pioneering role in the field of glass sculpture.

Eckhardt served as director of the FAP's Cleveland Ceramics and Sculpture Division from 1935 until 1942, where her work included a series of ceramic sculptures illustrating children's literature for public libraries. In the late 1940s she began to explore glass making and was credited with rediscovering the ancient Egyptian art of fusing gold leaf between sheets of glass to produce gold glass. Eckhardt received two John Simon Guggenheim Awards for Fine Arts (1956, 1959), the Louis Comfort Tiffany Fellowship in 1956, and a 1971 Cleveland Arts Prize Special Citation for Distinguished Service to the Arts, which highlighted her glass sculpture work.

Eckhardt also taught at colleges and universities throughout her career and was a regular contributor to *Ceramics Monthly* from 1954 on.

Scope and Contents:

A circa 1960s list of Eckhardt's artwork gives prices and notes owners who loaned works to an unnamed exhibition. One photograph is of artwork presumably by Eckhardt. One letter is from the Cleveland Museum of Art conveying a catalog for an exhibition not found in the papers. A nomination for an award is from the Ohio Arts Council. The rest of the collection consists of printed material including two exhibition catalogs with one for a retrospective at Ohio's Beachwood Museum, a newsletter entry announcing Eckhardt's selection for a 1977 Outstanding Craft Award, and clippings from circa 1940s-1982 documenting Eckhardt's exhibitions, awards, and other achievements throughout her career.
