Dorothy Eisner (1906-1984) was a social realist and abstract painter in New York City, New York. She was active in many arts organizations and helped to found the Federation of Modern Painters and Sculptors.

Scope and Contents:

Biographical materials include a resume, scattered financial materials concerning donations and a price list, and awards records. The bulk of the correspondence is from institutions acknowledging the receipt of donated paintings. Also found are letters thanking Eisner for her catalog from friends. Photographs are of works of art. Printed materials include clippings and exhibition announcements and catalogs.
