## **Biographical / Historical**

Philip John Evett (1923-2016) was a sculptor and educator in San Antonio, Texas. Born in Swanscombe, Kent in England, he studied at the Cambridge College of Art, England and the Belfast College of Art in Ireland. Evett moved to Texas in 1954 where he taught at Trinity University and the San Antonio Art Institute.
