**Summary:** The scattered papers of portrait painter Jane Freeman measure 0.5 linear

feet and date from 1904 to 1963. Largely concerning her portraits, the papers include biographical material, correspondence including letters from Walter Clifton, Frederick Stuart Church, and others, photographs of Freeman and of works of art, printed material, and writings and lectures on women in art and

portrait painting.

The donor, Mrs. Walter T. Wittman, was Freeman's niece and the executrix of Freeman's estate. She donated Jane Freeman's papers to the Archives of American Art in 1964.

The collection is available on 35mm microfilm reel 135 at Archives of American Art offices and through interlibrary loan. Researchers should note that the arrangement of the material described in the container inventory does not reflect the arrangement of the collection on microfilm.

## **Biographical / Historical**

Jane Freeman (1871-1963) was a portrait painter and educator in New York City, New York. Born in England, Freeman studied at the Art Students League, the Grand Chaumière, and at the Cooper Union Art School. She was known for her portraits of Dr. Albert Schweitzer and Mother Cabrini. Jane Freeman died in New Jersey in a sanitarium in 1963.

## **Scope and Contents**

The scattered papers of portrait painter Jane Freeman measure 0.5 linear feet and date from 1904 to 1963. Largely concerning her portraits, the papers include biographical material, correspondence including letters from Walter Clifton, Frederick Stuart Church, and others, photographs of Freeman and of works of art, printed material, and writings and lectures on women in art and portrait painting.

Scope and Contents:

Biographical materials consist of an award, a death notice, and a resume. Correspondence is with artists, colleagues, former students, and friends. Some letters may be from those who commissioned portraits from Freeman. Of note are illustrated letters from Walter Clifton and Frederick Stuart Church. Other correspondents include Hans Hacker, Elsie Merriman, Anne Stevenson Van de Water, George Verity, and Leah Verity. Photographs include portraits of Freeman, with her artwork, and with others. Also found are photographs of works of art. Clippings concern Freeman's career; reproductions of works of art include portraits and commercial advertisement artwork created for magazines and newspapers. Writings consist of lectures and talks, including a radio address by Freeman from 1935.
