Scope and Contents: Two scrapbooks contain clippings of news articles and reproductions of works of art on American artists, their careers, and paintings. The scrapbooks are annotated by Gazarian and some sections include handwritten narratives summarizing an artist's career. Some narratives are unattributed and others were transcribed from Royal Cortissoz.
