## **Biographical / Historical**

Galleries Guggenheim Jeune and Art Of This Century were owned by collector, dealer, and art patron, Peggy Guggenheim. Guggenheim opened Guggenheim Jeune Gallery in London in 1938 and began purchasing the works of artists she exhibited before closing the gallery in 1939. Between 1939-1941, when she was forced to return to the United States due to the German occupation of France, Guggeheim purchased art work and amassed the major part of her European collection. She opened Art of This Century on West 57th Street on her return to New York. The gallery closed in 1946, but was an important venue for emerging American artists and provided patronage to many of the Abstract Expresssionists who frequented her gallery, including Lee Krasner, Jackson Pollock, and many others.

### **Scope and Contents**

The Printed material relating to Guggenheim Jeune and Art of this Century galleries dates from 1938-1956 on 2 microfilm reels. The collection documents exhibitions and other events related to these two galleries operated by Peggy Guggenheim through exhibition catalogs, clippings, and other published material.

The collection documents exhibitions held at Guggenheim Jeune from 1938-1939, and Art Of This Century from 1941-1947. Also documented are exhibitions of Guggenheim's collection in various European cities from 1948-1951 and 1955-1956, and the Second International Exhibition of American Art held in Italy in 1953 in which artwork from Guggenheim's collection was included.
