Biographical / Historical

Adeline Oppenheim Guimard (1872-1965) was a portrait painter in Paris, France and New York City, New York. Born in New York, Adeline Oppenheim studied and worked in France and married Art Nouveau designer Hector Guimard (1867-1942) in 1909. She returned to New York City after her husband's death.

Scope and Contents

The scattered papers of Adeline Oppenheim Guimard measure 0.2 linear feet and date from circa 1900 to 1943. The bulk of the collection consists of photographs of Guimard's portraits and paintings. Also found is a photograph of her Paris studio and printed material.

Scope and Contents:

Photographs depict Guimard's Paris studio, possibly located in the Place Pigalle, and her works of art including some early paintings. The bulk of the photographs are of Guimard's portraits of children, men, and women, some of which are labeled with the subject's name. Of note are portraits of French World War I veterans. Also found are exhibition catalogs for Guimard's works, and issues of *The Art Digest, The Bookman*, and *The Paris Review*.
