Biographical / Historical

Sculptor Cleo Hartwig (1911-1988) was a direct carver active in New York City, New York, and in the Sculptor's Guild. She often produced small sculpture made of stone, wood, or terracotta, and was married to fellow sculptor Vincent Glinksy.

The scattered papers of sculptor Cleo Hartwig measure 0.5 linear feet and date from 1932 to 1979. Found are biographical materials, professional correspondence, an exhibition file, photographs of Hartwig and her sculpture, and printed material.

Scope and Contents:

Biographical materials include awards, resumes and an article written by Vincent Glinsky and Cleo Hartwig entitled "Direct Carving in Stone." Correspondence is with museums and institutions regarding Hartwig's works and exhibitions. Also found is an exhibition file from a travelling exhibition throughout Buffalo, New York and Canada in 1949 and 1950. Photographs are of Cleo Hartwig with her sculpture and of works of art. Most photographs of works of art are labeled with title and purchase information. Printed materials concern Hartwig and Glinsky and include clippings and exhibition announcements and catalogs.
