Laura Coombs Hills (1859-1952) was a painter from Newburyport and Boston, Massachusetts. She is known for miniature portraits, floral still-life works, and illustrations for children's books.

## **Scope and Contents**

The scattered papers of painter Laura Coombs Hills measure 0.2 linear feet and date from 1863 to 1952. Found are artworks including painted sketches and needlepoint designs, biographical material, correspondence, photographs, and printed material.

Scope and Contents:

Artworks include small oil sketches, watercolors, needlepoint designs, and sketches of fairies and ladybugs, possibly for children's books. Of note is a watercolor landscape noted to be Hills's first watercolor done at the age of four. Biographical materials include a biographical sketch and a diploma. Letters are written by Hills to her niece, Elizabeth McKay. Photographs depict Hills, her studio, Hill at events, and Hill's family. A tintype is of Hills as a young child with Laura Stevens. Many of the photos are of sisters Laura Coombs Hills, Louise Hills, and Lizzie Hills. Some photos of events include invitations. Printed material consists of clippings, published needlepoint designs and reproductions of works of art.
