## **Biographical / Historical**

Odon Hullenkremer (1888-1978) was a painter in Santa Fe, New Mexico. Born in Hungary, Hullenkremer studied in Europe and Egypt before settling in Toledo, Ohio. After returning to Europe for further study in the 1920s and 1930s, he established a studio in Santa Fe, New Mexico and was active there until his death in 1978.

## **Scope and Contents**

The papers of painter Odon Hullenkremer date from 1932 to 1961. The collection includes a letter, printed material, and clippings concerning Hullenkremer and New Mexico artists.
