ICOR (Idishe Kolonizatsie Organizatsie in Rusland), also known as the Organization for Jewish Colonization in the Soviet Union, was an organization in North America established to support the collective settlement of Jews. ICOR's exhibition was held at Fifty-Seven Fifth Avenue in 1936 and featured works of art by American Artists that were later to be presented to the State Museum in Birobidzhan as a gift.
