# **Biographical / Historical**

Gertrude Kasle (1917-2016) was an art collector, consultant, and art dealer. She was born in New York City, and later lived and worked in Detroit, Michigan, where she owned and operated the Kasle Gallery (1965-1976), known for its contemporary art.

# **Scope and Contents**

An interview of Gertrude Kasle conducted 1975 July 24, by Dennis Barrie, for the Archives of American Art. She discusses her early years in New York; opening the Kasle Gallery in Detroit; working with contemporary art and artists; introducing contemporary art to audiences in Michigan; the Detroit arts scene, and media coverage, among other topics. She discusses artists who exhibited at her gallery, including Philip Guston, Grace Hartigan, Larry Rivers,

Jack Tworkov, Robert Motherwell, Helen Frankenthaler, Willem de Kooning, Brenda Goodman, Ian Hornak, and Al Loving, among others.
