Sculptor and art dealer Maryna Kaston (1913-1989) was born in Poland and settled in New York City, New York. She was active in the Polish community of New York City which led to her acquaintance with pianist Arthur Rubinstein.

Found are papers regarding Maryna Kaston's efforts to commission, fundraise for, and install a bronze bust of Arthur Rubinstein by Nathan Rapoport in Carnegie Hall. Correspondence consists of Kaston's letters to Leonard Bernstein, the Carnegie Hall Corporation, Van Cliburn, Guarneri Quartet, Hurok Concerts Inc., Zubin Metha, RCA Records, Theodore Steinway, Isaac Stern, and others, and some replies. Also found are photographs of the installation of the bust depicting the sculpture and Kaston and Rubinstein. Printed materials include announcements and clippings about the sculpture.
