Luman Pierre Kelsey (1905-1961) was a self-taught ceramicist, photographer, and sculptor in North Canton, Connecticut. He was married to painter and printmaker Dorothea Storey Kelsey.

Scope and Contents:

A biographical sketch of Luman Kelsey was written by Dorothea Storey Kelsey in a letter to the Archives of American Art. Additional scattered correspondence is with Dorothea Kelsey and institutions regarding Luman's artwork. A handwritten account by Luman describes his cast stone process when sculpting. Printed material consists of clippings and exhibition catalogs. Also found is a self-published guide to the Virgin Islands written by Sally Kelsey at the age of eleven and illustrated with her father Luman's works of art. Photographs include Kelsey's fine art photos and are also of works of art and of Luman in his studio creating ceramics.
