records, printed and digital material, fourteen sketchbooks and other works of art, and photographs, including a photo of the MacDowell Colony in 1957.

Biographical / Historical

Vera Klement (1929-) is a painter and educator in Chicago, Illinois. She is a founding member of "The FIVE."

Vera Klement was born in Danzig, Germany (now Gdańsk, Poland). She came to the United States in 1938 to escape the Nazi regime and settled in New York City. Klement studied at the Cooper Union School of Art and Architecture, graduating in 1950. After moving to Chicago in 1965, she taught at the University of Chicago from 1969 to 1995 and is a Professor Emerita. She became a founding member of "The FIVE," a group of artists, who protested what they saw as a regionalist bent in Chicago art during the early 1970s.

Klement continues to live and work in Chicago, Illinois.

Scope and Contents

The papers of painter and educator Vera Klement measure 3.3 linear feet and 1.36 GB and date from 1950 to circa 2016. The papers include scattered correspondence with Franz Schulze and others, writings and notes including digital copies of a memoir, an interview, and a film, personal business records, printed and digital material, fourteen sketchbooks and other works of art, and photographs, including a photo of the MacDowell Colony in 1957.

Of note is *Blunt Edge*, an unpublished memoir by Klement in born-digital format; a born-digital recording of an oral history by Linda Kramer and Sandra Binion (2010); a born-digital copy of a film entitled *Vera Klement: Blunt Edge*, by Wonjung Bae; a bound volume, *Disorder and Early Sorrow: a Meditation on War and Death in Homage to Picasso's Guernica 1937*, by Vera Klement; and a poetry project compiled by Klement entitled *Born of Silence*.

Due to its small size the collection is arranged as one series.

Scope and Contents:

Scattered correspondence is between Klement and various artists, critics, and institutions, including: Altedena Gallery, Dore Ashton, Chicago Symphony Orchestra, Jim McGarrell, Gerald Nordland, The Print Club, Franz Schulze, Clara Diament Sujo, Terra Museum of American Art, and the University of Chicago. Also found are 7 folders of greeting and holiday cards.

Writings by Klement include *Blunt Edge: A Memoir* in born-digital form, artists statements, notes about art and teaching, poetry, and a eulogy for Harold Rosenberg. Notebooks consist of guest comment notebooks from a 1999 exhibition at the Chicago Cultural Center and a notebook compiled while at the MacDowell Colony.

Oral histories consist of a transcript conducted by John Himmelfarb (1985) and a born-digital audio recording by Linda Kramer and Sandra Binion. A born-digital video by Wonjung Bae is entitled *Vera Klement: Blunt Edge* (2010). A project file contains Klement's *Born of Silence*, a compilation of poetry by eight poets.

Personal business records contain material relating to the donation and sale of Klement's works to various institutions and museums. Printed material includes exhibition materials and clippings related to Klement's work and career.

Works of art include fourteen sketchbooks, loose drawing, and etchings. Also found is a bound volume, *Disorder and Early Sorrow: a Meditation on War and Death in Homage to Picasso's Guernica* 1937 (2010), a book of collages, drawings, and diptychs.

Photographs depict Klement, and Klement with her artwork and in her studio, 1964-1980. Also found is a 1957 group photograph of the MacDowell Colony.
