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## **Biographical / Historical**

Gerda Meyer Bernstein (1923-2024) was a Chicago, Illinois installation artist whose works comment on global issues and crises and include a number of installations dedicated to Holocaust remembrance. She used non-traditional materials including discarded objects.

Born in Westphalia, Meyer Bernstein escaped Nazi Germany on one of the last Kindertransports of 1940. She studied at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago in the early 1950s and worked there as a teaching assistant before graduating with an M.F.A. in 1978. Meyer Bernstein was a founding member of the Artists in Residence Gallery and her work has been shown in the Art Institute's *Chicago & Vicinity* annual exhibition three times.

## **Scope and Contents**

The papers of installation artist Gerda Meyer Bernstein measure 1.2 linear feet and date from 1973 to 2015. Included are biographical materials, correspondence, ten notebooks, scattered general project files, printed material, digital recordings of interviews, and a video recording concerning Meyer Bernstein's installation *Chicago Crossings: Bridges and Boundaries*.

Scope and Contents:

Biographical materials consist of a resume and artist statements on Meyer Bernstein's works of art. Correspondence is scattered and largely concerns the proposal and implementation of artworks. Also found are a video recording of the gallery installation of *Chicago Crossings: Bridges and Boundaries*, and digital recordings of interviews with NPR and SAIC.

The bulk of the collection consists of ten notebooks which contain Meyer Bernstein's working notes, research, and ideas for projects. They are labeled with broad annotations of the subjects contained. Project files contain installation directions, correspondence, notes, and photographs. Printed material consists of exhibition announcements and catalogs. Also found are compiled reviews of Meyer Bernstein's various installations and gallery exhibitions.
