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Biographical / Historical

The Michigan Art and Craft Project was a division of the Federal Art Project. Charles Pollock was the supervisor of the project.

Scope and Contents

The Michigan Art and Craft project records measure 0.7 linear feet and date from circa 1040-1942. Included is financial documents; project statistics; descriptions of programs; letters to Charles Pollock; a clipping about Pollock's mural in Lansing, Michigan; photographs of artists: Clivia Calder, Samuel Cashwan, and Frank Casava with their works; and photographs of works of artists and art by Marvin Beerbohm, David Fredenthal, Walter Speck, and Edgar Yaeger and others including mural work, wood carving, silkscreen manufacture and other crafts. Also included are photographs of posters that are signed by Maurice Merlin, and others that may be attributed to Merlin, as well as clippings of newspaper artwork produced by Merlin for the Los Angeles Times during the early 1940's.
