## Biographical / Historical

Jeanne Patterson Miles (1908-1990) was a painter, sculptor and educator in New York City, New York. Born in Baltimore, Maryland, Miles studied at George Washington University, Grand Chaumiere, Paris, and with Marcel Gromaire. She taught at Moravin College for Women, Oberlin College, and the New York Institute of Technology.

Scope and Contents: Biographical materials include a resume, a writing, and a personal postcard collage by Lenore Tawney sent to Miles. Correspondence is with friends, family, and institutions including Edward Burns, Paul Katz, Lillian Kiesler, Pamela Sherin, and Lenore Tawney. Photographs depict Miles, Miles in her home and with her art, and her works of art. Printed materials consist of exhibition announcements and catalogs and a photocopy of clippings of Miles's newspaper column on art. Also found is a mixed media scrapbook containing exhibition announcements and catalogs, scattered correspondence, clippings, a photograph of Miles and a photo of her daughter, Joanna Miles.
