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Biographical / Historical

Florence Resnikoff (1920-2013) was a metalsmith known for jewelry design in the San Francisco Bay Area of California. Born in Texas, Resnikoff studied art and learned the basics of jewelry making at the Ox-Bow Summer School of Painting through the Art Institute of Chicago. She focused on jewelry, working with metals and enamel after moving to San Francisco in 1951. In addition to exhibiting her works widely around the California and the United States, Resnikoff taught at the California College of Arts and Crafts.

Scope and Contents

The papers of metalsmith and educator Florence Resnikoff (1920-2013) measure 1.2 linear feet and date from 1945 to 2011. The papers focus on Resnikoff's career as a professional metalsmith producing jewelry and liturgical artworks. Found are biographical material including, correspondence, subject files, personal business records, photographs, and printed material.

Scope and

Biographial materials contain artist statements, awards, biographical sketches, blank stationery, and Contents: a copy of a 1953 flyer used to publicize and sell her jewelry pieces. One electronic disc (cd) contains copies of her resume and portaits. Resnikoff's professional correspondence is with galleries and institutions concerning the exhibition and sale of her artwork. Also found are fan mail letters from customers. Subject files concern her involvement in the Midwest Designer Craftsmen organization; her study of palladium which includes original writings and printed material; and a conference. Also found are files relating to the sale of liturgical artwork at the Church of the Presentation in Stockton, California, St Mary/Francis de Sales in Oakland, California, St Anne Catholic Church in Las Vegas, Nevada, and St. Jerome Church in El Cerrito, California.

> Personal business records contain employment records from the California College of the Arts; educational records from San Jose State University; as well receipts for metallurgy services, records of the sales of her works, and pricelists. Of note is a detailed list of works involved in a burglary. Two photographs are from Resnikoff's time at artist summer camps in Saugaruck, Michigan. A 1945 photo from Ox-Bow, the summer school of the Art Institute of Chicago is of Resnikoff painting with Jane Bacher. Also found is a photograph of an outdoor painting class from 1949 or 1950 labeled the Michigan Pot Shop. Other photographs are of a Resnikoff giving a demonstration of electroforming, and of a conference in Peru.

> Printed materials consist of clippings and exhibition announcements and catalogs for group and solo shows.
