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# **Biographical / Historical**

Doris Patty Rosenthal (1889-1971) was a painter, lithographer, designer, and educator who traveled frequently throughout Mexico and painted scenes of Mexican life and culture.

Rosenthal earned a degree in teaching from Los Angeles State Teachers College in 1910, and Teachers College of Columbia University in 1913. She taught painting and drawing in Columbia University's Teachers College from 1924 to 1931, and then taught at James Monroe High School in the Bronx.

Rosenthal moved permanently to Mexico in 1957, and died in the city of Oaxaca in 1971

## **Scope and Contents**

The scattered papers of painter Doris Rosenthal measure 0.2 linear feet and date from 1932 to circa 1971. Found are writings by Rosenthal on Mexico and Latin America, an inventory of works of art, photographs, and printed material.
