Sam Ross (1912-1998) was a novelist and television screenwriter in Chicago, Illinois and Los Angeles, California.

Charlotte Rothstein Ross (1912-1991) was a painter active in New York City, New York and Los Angeles, California. She was educated at the Chicago Art Institute.

Scope and Scattered material on Charlotte Ross includes a biographical sketch and three catalogs from group exhibitions in which Ross participated. All three catalogs were for shows in Illinois and two were produced by the Federal Art Project, Works Progress Administration. Also found are two radio scripts written by Sam Ross during the Illinois Writers Project and originally aired on WBBM in Chicago. The radio program series was called *Moments with Genius* and the two programs concern deep sea diving and phosphates.
