Biographical / Historical

René Santos (1954-1986) was a painter, photographer, and educator in New York, New York. Santos was born Carlos René Santos in Puerto Rico. He received a bachelor's degree from Tufts University in 1973 and a master's degree in 1976 from Hunter College where he studied with art critic Rosalind Krauss. His

work is in the collections of The New Museum of Contemporary Art in New York and the Museo de Arte de Puerto Rico in San Juan, Puerto Rico. Santos's work has been shown in numerous exhibitions including several held after he died in 1986.

Scope and Contents

Biographical material includes an address book, resume, passport and other official documents, a few financial records, Santos's 1972 yearbook, and one sound recording of Santos's memorial service. A small amount of correspondence is with William Olander, Allen Memorial Art Museum, Oberlin College, as well as sympathy letters to Brad Baker after Santos's death. Writings include one diary and writings on art, photography, and science by Santos, as well as notes taken by Santos possibly as a student and as a teacher. Also found are clippings, exhibition announcements and catalogs, and a photocopy of a book segment about style. Photographs include slides of Santos traveling in Cape Cod and Nova Scotia with friends and at the Gray Gallery Dog Show, as well as slides, photographs, and a negative of works of art by Santos.
