Dorothy Seiberling (1922-2019) was an art editor in New York, New York. Seiberling began her career at *Life* magazine in 1943 and became senior art editor in 1965.

Scope and Contents:

Files were accumulated by Dorothy Seiberling while she was art editor for *Life* Magazine. A file on William Harnett contains copyprints of photographs of Harnett in his studio, and with his family. Materials relating to Henry McBride include a typescript of an article by Lincoln Kirstein on McBride; letters from McBride to Seiberling; a catalog of the sale of McBride's collection; a list of works shown in a 1949 exhibition in his honor; photographs of miscellaneous art works; and clippings of his newspaper articles. Letters from Roger Alfredo Michahelles to Seiberling concern Hiram Powers. Also found are copyprints of Powers and his artwork. Original photographs are of Everett Shinn and William Sommer. A typescript with accompanying notes entitled "I Remember New York," is by Shinn.
