# **Biographical / Historical**

Carroll Harris Simms (1924-2010) was an African American sculptor, ceramicist, and educator in Houston, Texas. Simms was born in Arkansas in 1924 and moved to Toledo, Ohio as a child. He attended Hampton University, Toledo University, and the Toledo Museum School of Art. He became the first Black student to graduate from the Cranbrook Academy of Art in 1950. He began a long teaching career at Texas Southern University where he taught sculpture and ceramics until retiring in 1987. Carroll Harris Simms died in 2010 in Texas.

# **Scope and Contents**

The papers of sculptor and educator Carroll Harris Simms measure 0.4 linear feet and date from 1945 to 1980. Found are biographical materials, correspondence, photographs, printed material, and sketches.

Scope and Contents:

Found are biographical materials including a curriculum vitae and an introduction for Simms by R. Akinsola A. Akiwowo in 1968. Correspondence is with Cranbrook Academy of Art, Elizabeth Gassan, Hampton Institute (Hampton University), Joseph Jay, Margaret Lockhart McKelvy, and Toledo Museum of Art, among others. Photographs depict Simms with his art and with groups, likely school classes. Photographs of works of art are of his jewelry, murals, pottery, and sculpture. Printed materials concern the exhibition of Simms's artwork. Also found are pencil sketches, possibly for sculpture that was later produced.
