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Biographical / Historical

Mary Bates Swiss (1925-1998) was sculptor Janet de Coux's studio assistant. Swiss and de Coux studied together at the Cranbook Academy of Art.

Janet de Coux (1904-2000) was a sculptor and participated in the Federal Arts Project.

Scope and Contents

The letters from sculptor Janet de Coux to Mary Bates Swiss and Martha Bates Swiss measure 0.4 linear feet and date from 1944 to 1990. Primarily letters, the collection describes the close relationship between Janet de Coux and her studio assistant and friend Mary Bates Swiss and Swiss's daughter, Martha Bates Swiss. Also found are scattered handmade greeting cards by de Coux, poetry, two photographs, and a clipping.

Scope and Contents:

Comprising the bulk of the series are 130 letters from sculptor Janet de Coux to her studio assistant Mary Bates Swiss and to Swiss's daughter Martha Bates Swiss. Also found are scattered letters to Martha's siblings and handmade greeting cards. de Coux writes about her works in progress, her emotional state of mind, her relationships, her philosophy of life, and her travels. Handwritten poems, sent to Mary Swiss from de Coux, are by others or are unsigned. Also included are two photographs of de Coux's sculpture of William Penn in progress in her studio in Gibsonia, Pennsylvania with her and Martha Swiss's poodle, Gigi. One clipping concerns de Coux's sculpture of William Penn.
