## **Biographical / Historical**

Czech-born painter Joseph Tomanek (1889-1974) was active in Chicago and trained at the Art Institute of Chicago and studied at the Academy of Fine Arts in Prague on a scholarship. Tomanek received several prizes and honorable mentions from the Bohemian Arts Club and other art leagues in Chicago during the course of his career.

## Scope and Contents

The papers of painter Joseph Tomanek measure 0.2 linear feet and date from 1918-1960, providing scattered documentation of Tomanek's career. The collection includes letters from Rudolph Ingerle, William S. Schwartz, and Albin Polasek; a pencil drawing of a nude by Tomanek; printed materials, including clippings and programs related to Tomanek's career; and photographs of Tomanek, his wife, Schwartz, Polasek, and works of art.

Scope and Series includes letters from Rudolph Ingerle, William S. Schwartz, and Albin Polasek and a list of galleries and individuals. Also found are clippings primarily related to Tomanek's career; a pencil drawing of a nude by Tomanek; and photographs of Tomanek, his wife, William and Mrs. Schwartz, Polasek, and works of art. Programs include an auction and exhibition program, a program for the Society for Sanity in Art, Inc. Review which lists Tomanek as a 1938 first prize winner in oil painting, and a brochure for the Albin Polasek Foundation signed by Polasek's wife.
