Consuelo Jimenez Underwood (1949-) is a weaver, textile artist and educator in Cupertino, California. She taught at San Jose State University, San Jose, California.

Scope and Contents

The papers of textile artist and weaver, Consuelo Jimenez Underwood, measure 10.4 linear feet and date from 1970-2019. The papers document Underwood's life and career as a multicultural artist and educator. Included are color and textile samples and a handmade fabric sample book, notes and writings, printed material, correspondence, project and teaching files, artist's statements, sketches, and childhood photographs depicting images of Underwood in the fields working with her parents.
