## **Biographical / Historical**

Theresa Van Raalte (1886-1973) was a painter in St. Louis, Missouri. Van Raalte traveled to Holland in 1905 to study oil painting with Fritz Mondrian, the first teacher of Piet Mondrian, his nephew. She became acquainted with many artists in The Hague School.

## **Scope and Contents**

The scattered papers of St. Louis painter Theresa Van Raalte measure 0.2 linear feet and date from 1905 to circa 1913. The bulk of the material focuses on Van Raalte's trip to Netherlands where she studied in 1905. Found is a diary, two photographs, and a sketchbook.
