Biographical / Historical

Sylvia Wald (1915-2011) was a sculptor and printmaker in New York City, New York. She worked as an art teacher with the Works Progress Administration and began to experiment with silkscreen techniques with oil paint. Later in her career, Wald worked in sculpture and assemblage. She exhibited her work in solo and

group shows around the United States and with the Art in Embassies program through the U.S. Department of State.

Scope and Contents

The papers of New York printmaker and sculptor Sylvia Wald measure 0.6 linear feet and date from 1939 to circa 1979. Found are biographical materials, correspondence, personal business records, photographs, and printed material.

Scope and Contents:

Biographical materials include a resume and lists of institutions that hold Wald's works of art. Largely, correspondence relates to Wald's career and concerns exhibitions and participation in the Art in Embassies program. Correspondents include Kenneth Auvil, Justus Bier, Bruce Cody, and gallerist Devorah Sherman. Gallery correspondence may include lists of works of art and sales records. Also found are general sales and price lists. Photographs include one portrait of Wald, a photo of an unidentified exhibition of sculpture, and photographs of works of art. Printed materials consist of clippings, exhibition announcements and catalogs, and press releases focusing on Wald's exhibitions and career.
