Biographical / Historical

James Milford Zornes (1908-2008) was an educator, painter, and watercolorist in California. Known as Milford Zornes, he was born in Oklahoma and moved to California as a teenager. He studied at the Otis Art Institute and Pomona College, and took classes with Millard Sheets at Scripps College. Zornes was active in the California Water Color Society.

Scope and Contents:

Two mixed-media scrapbooks contain biographical materials, correspondence, clippings, exhibition announcements and catalogs, and scattered photographs of Zornes and works of art. The scrapbooks focus on Zornes's career as a painter and the exhibition of his paintings throughout California and the United States including the California Water Color Society, Denver Art Museum, Pomona College, Seattle Art Museum, and others.

Additional material concerns Zornes's work with various Depression-era art projects, including the Treasury Department Public Works of Art Project and murals at the Claremont, California post office. Found is correspondence regarding the purchase of Zornes's watercolors for the PWAP, purchase orders, and printed material. Also found is a photo of the post office mural, and rules for executing the murals distributed to artists.
