Notes: Robert Hall leads school children in an educational talk about Alvin Ailey's work and personal life. Using a flannel board as an interactive tool, Hall discusses some of Ailey's biographical

information, including his birthplace in Rogers, TX in 1939, and his single mother whom he followed to California when he was a child. Hall goes on to discuss some of Ailey's interests outside of dance, including running track, playing tuba, and writing stories. Additionally, Hall describes Ailey's early interest in dance after meeting Carme de

Lavallade.

Hall discusses Ailey's place in the history of dance and ballet, citing his common topics which relate to African American history and segregation. Hall presents Ailey's *Cry*, featuring Judith Jamison, a dedication to his mother and all Black women, especially mothers.

Hall leads the children through a tour of the exhibition *Body & Soul:* The Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, where the students see portraits of Ailey's dance studio members, Ailey's teacher Lester Horton, and Ailey's romantic partner and muse, de Lavallade. The exhibit features a dress worn by Katherine Dunham, whom Ailey saw dance when he was fourteen years old, and who wore the dress in a dance choreographed by Ailey.

Hall discusses *Blues Suite*, dedicated to the people Ailey witnessed during his time in Texas, shows costumes used in the ballet and playing audio for the students. Hall similarly discusses Ailey's *Revelations*, which was inspired by Black churches and was usually the last dance performed at an Ailey recital, and shows costumes, an umbrella, and a fan which were used in the ballet. Hall briefly recounts *Cry* for the students, and describes *Opus McShann*, inspired

by bandleader and composer Jay McShann, and *Night Creatures*, which was named after a composition by Duke Ellington.

The exhibition was organized by the New York Public Library for the Performing Arts, and on display at the Anacostia Museum from March 28, 1993 - June 13, 1993.
