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Nota biográfica/histórica

Olivia Cadaval, mentora, académica y activista comunitaria, nació en Ciudad de México en 1943. Dedicó más de cuatro décadas a crear espacios para que las comunidades latinas y otros grupos marginados pudieran expresar sus voces e identidades, tanto en el área metropolitana de Washington, D.C., como en la Institución Smithsonian.

Olivia llegó a Estados Unidos en 1961 para estudiar en el MacMurray College de Jacksonville, Illinois. En 1968 se mudó a Washington, D.C., donde empezó a colaborar con trabajadores culturales, artistas, educadores, periodistas y otras personas en proyectos comunitarios culturales y políticos.

En las décadas de 1970 y 1980, cuando la comunidad latina en Washington D.C. comenzó a consolidarse, Olivia estuvo a la vanguardia documentando su historia y creando espacios para que la gente contara sus historias. Su investigación de historia oral sobre *El Festival Latino* fue la primera y sigue siendo una de las exploraciones más exhaustivas de la construcción de la comunidad, la creación de espacios y la construcción de identidad latina en el área metropolitana de Washington, D.C. Dirigió *El Centro de Arte*, una organización artística que apoyaba el trabajo cultural y artístico de artistas latinos y latinoamericanos. En 1976, Olivia fue contratada como enlace cultural para el programa del bicentenario del Smithsonian Folklife Festival, y más tarde se convirtió en curadora del Centro de Tradiciones Populares y Patrimonio Cultural tras completar su doctorado en Estudios Americanos y Folklore en 1988.

Su trabajo en el Centro dio lugar a múltiples programas del Festival, incluyendo *Islas Vírgenes Estadounidenses* (1990), *Fronteras México-Estados Unidos* (1993), *El Río* (2000), *Nuestra Música* (2004 y 2005), *México* (2010), *Colombia: La Naturaleza de la Cultura* (2011) y *Perú: Pachamama* (2015). Además de su trabajo en el Festival, Olivia contribuyó al desarrollo de materiales educativos, exposiciones, talleres y programas en línea. Sus publicaciones incluyen *Creando una Identidad Latina en la Capital de la Nación: El Festival Latino* (1998) y (como coeditora) *Conversaciones Curatoriales: Representación Cultural y el Festival de Folklore del Smithsonian* (2016). En la década de 1990, también formó parte de un grupo de empleados latinos del Smithsonian que se unieron para exigir una mayor representación en la dirección y la programación y un mayor acceso a los recursos. Los resultados de estos esfuerzos aún resuenan.

Olivia se jubiló de la Institución Smithsonian en 2017, pero se mantuvo activa. Además de ejercer como mentora y asesora de varios estudiantes, siguió desarrollando y asesorando programas comunitarios. En 2018, comisarió *La Esquina*, una exposición fotográfica que rendía homenaje a la vida callejera de la comunidad latina de Washington.

Trabajó con colegas del Museo Nacional del Latino Estadounidense en una exposición que explora los movimientos sociales entre la juventud latina en el área de Washington, D.C., y aparece en *Somos* (2022), un cortometraje creado para la exposición inaugural del museo.

Olivia Cadaval falleció el 8 de abril de 2025.

Biographical / Historical

Olivia Cadaval, mentor, scholar, and community activist, was born in Mexico City in 1943. She spent more than four decades creating spaces for Latino and other marginalized communities to assert their voices and identities in both the Washington, D.C., metropolitan area and at the Smithsonian.

Olivia came to the United States in 1961 to study at MacMurray College in Jacksonville, Illinois. She then moved to the D.C. area in 1968, Olivia, where she began collaborating with cultural workers, artists, educators, journalists, and others on community-based cultural and political projects.

In the 1970s and '80s, when the Latino community in the D.C. area began to assert its presence, Olivia was at the vanguard of documenting its history and creating spaces for people to tell their stories. Her oral history research on El Festival Latino was the first and still one of the most comprehensive explorations of community building, placemaking, and identity construction among Latinos in the D.C. area. She directed El Centro de Arte, an arts organization that supported cultural work and art among Latino and Latin American artists. In 1976, Olivia was hired as a cultural liaison for the Smithsonian Folklife Festival's bicentennial program, and later became a curator at the Center for Folklife and Cultural Heritage after completing her PhD in American studies and folklife in 1988.

Her work at the Center resulted in multiple Festival programs, including *U.S. Virgin Islands* (1990), *U.S.-Mexico Borderlands* (1993), *El Río* (2000), *Nuestra Música* (2004 and 2005), *México* (2010), *Colombia: The Nature of Culture* (2011), and *Perú: Pachamama* (2015). In addition to her work on the Festival, Olivia contributed to the development of education materials, exhibitions, workshops, and online programs. Her publications include *Creating a Latino Identity in the Nation's Capital: The Latino Festival* (1998) and (as co-editor) *Curatorial Conversations: Cultural Representation and the Smithsonian Folklife Festival* (2016). In the 1990s, she was also part of a group of Latino staff members at the Smithsonian who came together to demand broader representation in leadership and programming and greater access to resources. The results of these efforts reverberate today.

Olivia retired from the Smithsonian Institution in 2017, but she remained active. In addition to serving as a mentor and advisor to several students, she continued to develop and consult on community-based programs. In 2018, she curated *La Esquina*, a photo exhibition that paid homage to street life in the D.C. Latino community. She worked with colleagues from the National Museum of the American Latino on an exhibition that explores social movements among Latino youth in the D.C. area, and she is featured in *Somos* (2022), a short film created for the museum's inaugural exhibition.

Olivia Cadaval died on April 8, 2025.
