### **Biographical / Historical**

English missionaries Ernest Henshaw (circa 1895-?) and Georgina Henshaw (nee Mortimer) (circa 1895-?) married in 1923 and moved to Minna. They worked and raised a family there until Georgina caught Malaria around 1930, at which point the family returned to England.

### **Scope and Contents**

The collection consists of 32 black and white photographs taken in northern Nigeria in the 1920s. They primarily focus on the Henshaw missionary family, their work, and their community in proximity to the city of Minna, Niger State, Nigeria.
