Angkor, circa 1960 Film reels (45 minutes; color sound; 1944 feet) Edited film on Angkor, the ancient capital of the Khmers founded Notes: in the first century A.D. by Khmers from northeast Burma who brought Indian civilization to Cambodia as explained in the narration. Film discusses the architecture and religious iconography of 18 temples and sanctuaries (in chronological order of their historical construction) dating from the 10th to 13th centuries. Also featured are scenes of Cambodian village life and excerpts from a Royal Cambodian Ballet performance.
