documents the 1979 wedding of the highest ranking woman in contemporary Tongan society, the daughter of the king of Tonga. Depicted are the blending of European and Tongan traditions in the ceremony including the traditional presentation of bridal gifts, the kava ceremony, and the *laka-laka>*, a

performance which integrates song, dance, and poetry.

Groups which took part came from Australia, Austral Islands, Cook Islands, Easter Island, Fiji, Guam, Hawaii, Marquesas, Nauru, New Caledonia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Ponape, Saipan/Marianas, Solomon Islands, American Samoa, Western Samoa, Tahiti, Tokelau, Tonga, Tuvalu, and Wallis/Futuna.
