Aborigines of the Sea Coast, 1950 1 Film reel (color sound; 711 feet; 16mm)

Notes:

Edited film by the Australian Film Board depicts life among the Yirrkalla Aborigines of coastal Arnhem Land on the Gulf of Carpentaria, Australia. Film reveals acculturative influences from Malay traders and missionaries and a nearby airforce base. Malay influences documented include bark canoes, metal tools, and tobacco smoking. Aborigines are seen hunting, fishing, gathering, cooking, and building huts. Children are shown sketching in the sand and dancing. Film is believed to be a record of the American Australian Scientific Expedition to Arnhem Land.

Capital of Earth: the Maroons of Moore Town, 1979

1 Film reel (color sound; 1,440 feet; 16mm)

Notes:

Edited film shot in eastern Jamaica among the descendants of escaped African slaves who formed rebel communities in the Blue Mountains. Depicted are aspects of Maroon culture including communal labor (with digging songs), Kromanti drumming and healing rights, and cultivation and marketing of agricultural produce.

Children of Bangkok, 1971

1 Film reel (color sound; 675 feet; 16mm)

Notes:

Edited film by Film Australia examines a day in the life of three young boys from the upper, middle, and lower classes of Bangkok (Thailand) society. Boys are seen at school, at play, and with their friends and families.

Desert People, 1966

1 Film reel (black-and-white sound; 1,860 feet; 16mm)

Notes:

Edited film produced by the Australian Commonwealth Film Unit and the Australian Institute of Aboriginal Studies depicting life among two Aborigine families of Australia's western desert. Shown are subsistence activities including hunting of lizards

and marsupials and gathering of root and insects. Explored is the adaptation of Aborigines to their environment through simple technology and social organization.

Harvest at Nong Lub, 1971

1 Film reel (color sound; 694 feet; 16mm)

Notes:

Edited film by Film Australia shows the arduous family work associated with a Thai rice harvest. Scenes of harvest activities are followed by a day of threshing and a community celebration which includes dancing and feasting.

Marvel, a Jakarta Boy, 1974

1 Film reel (color sound; 605 feet; 16mm)

Notes:

Edited film by Film Australia follows a teenage boy from a migrant Minangkabu family seeking a new way of life in the busy city of Jakarta, Java (Indonesia). His Islamic family survives in part through cloth trading and through the boy's selling of ricecakes outside a tourist hotel.

Mastri, a Balinese Woman, 1974

1 Film reel (color sound; 653 feet; 16mm)

Notes:

Edited film by Film Australia details the daily life of a a contemporary Balinese woman from the village of Tungjuk, Bali. Depicted are routines of rice agriculture, marketing, cooking, music and dance, and religious practices. Acculturation in family life is revealed as salient theme.

1 Film reel (color sound; 487 feet; 16mm)

Notes:

Edited film by Film Australia about Australian artisans and three crafts: textile or macrame weaving, hammered metal craft, and ceramic wheel artistry. Scenes of kite flying, fine arts motifs, and country living with documentation are interwoven.

Indian dance teacher and examines the Indian guru-disciple

relationship.

Pak Menggung: a Javanese Aristocrat, 1974 1 Film reel (color sound; 740 feet; 16mm)

Notes:

Edited film by Film Australia explores the life of Pak Menggung, a descendant of Javanese royalty who lives in Sulu, Java (Indonesia). Film details how the elderly aristocrat perpetuates his traditional language, material culture, and customs in a society altered by Dutch colonialism.

Sinaga's Family: a Batak Village, 1974 1 Film reel (color sound; 660 feet; 16mm)

Notes:

Edited film by Film Australia depicting the daily life in a small fishing village of Lake Toba, Indonesia, inhabited by fifteen Christian families. Sinaga, the head of one of these families, is profiled in his role as both fisherman and rice farmer.

Notes:

Edited film depicting the daily life of an Indian swami in the Kulu Valley of the Himalayas. The swami communicates philosophical understandings of his tradition and demonstrates techniques of meditation. Legacy Keywords: Meditation Hinduism Northern India;

Taram, a Minangkabau Village, 1974 1 Film reel (color sound; 790 feet; 16mm)

Notes:

Edited film, by Film Australia, is set in the village of Taram in southern Sumatra. Film depicts daily life in a matrilineal society where clan inheritance is passed from mother to daughter. Featured is Datuk Panjan, a man of high rank, and a cermony in which hereditary clan leaders are raised to the position of *datuk*.

are explored.

administrative functions, and rural visits.

Edited film by Film Australia depicting the life of the Hasans, Notes:

a family of Buginese traders, who operate a fleet of boats out of the western Javanese port of Surabaya. Once pirates of the Java Sea, the Bugis today run trading junks among the

Indonesian islands.

1 Film reel (color sound; 882 feet; 16mm)

Notes:

Edited film by Film Australia presents a journey through central Australia with a group of Aborigines and C.P. Mountford, an anthropologist whose account of his experiences demonstrates his affection for his companions. Film depicts hunting and gathering techniques used by the Aborigines, cooking and consumption of food, cavewall paintings, and the landscape of the central Australian desert.
