Biographical / Historical

Commander Karl E. Stein was a member of several expeditions including the Mitchell Hedges-Richmond Brown Exploratory Expedition and the Snyder Mountain Expedition. His military service during World War II found him in the South Pacific, Arctic and Mediterranean. After the War he turned to creating travel films for the travel-lecture circuit. His wife, Flora M. Stein, recorded the country's music to accompany the presentations.

Scope and Contents

Collection consists of 8 travelogue films of the following locales: Morocco, Brazil, Iran, India, Ceylon, Thailand, South Korea, and Taiwan. Collection also contains audiotapes of lectures, still photographs, and publicity brochures.

Please note that the contents of the collection and the language and terminology used reflect the context and culture of the time of its creation. As an historical document, its contents may be at odds with contemporary views and terminology and considered offensive today. The information within this collection does not reflect the views of the Smithsonian Institution or Anthropology Archives, but is available in its original form to facilitate research.

Stein Notes: and documents travel in Morocco presenting how people live, work and play and their homes, schools and industries. Locales visited include Casablanca, Rabat; Safi, the sardine capital of the world; Essaouira, formerly Mogador (marguetry); the walled city of Tiznit; Goulimine's camel market; Tiznit; Marrakesy; Volubilis; Fez (minarets and mosques); and the Sahara Desert . Also filmed are travelling the road across the High Atlas Mountains to Marrakesh (Djemaa-el-Fna square); the Moussem (a religious festival) at Tan-Tan; handicraft school at Azrou; interior of a Moroccan home; Moulay Idriss, a holy place; and the "Kasbah Road" to Erfoud. Scenes also include military displays, belly dancers and other dancing, a fish factory, pottery making, gathering and carving wood, bookbinding, painting, markets, contemporary and historical architecture, beaches, rural areas, churches, castles, fishing trawlers, and tree-climbing goats. Edited film is a travel-lecture film created by Karl E. Stein and documents travel in Brazil presenting how people live, work and play and their homes, schools and industries. Locales visited include Rio de Janeiro, Sao Paulo, the old mining town of Ouro Preto, the "modern" Brazilia, Salvador, Belem (fishing), and Manaus (Amazon River). Also filmed are a fazenda in the interior and, by way of contrast, large industrial complexes and Iguacu Falls.

Edited film is a travel-lecture film created by Karl E. Stein and documents travel in India presenting how people live, work and play and their homes, schools and handicrafts. Locales visited include Delhi, Kashmir; the Shalimar Gardens; Dal Lake (houseboats); Agra (Taj Mahal, Itmad-ud-daula's tomb, and Khajuraho Temples); Benares (Varanasi); Jaipur (Palace of the Winds); Udaipur (marble palaces); and Bombay. Also filmed is a wedding and a visit to a Maharajah palace.

Intriguing Iran, 1972

Edited film is a travel-lecture film created by Karl E. Stein and documents travel in Iran presenting how people live, work and play and their homes, schools and industries. Locales visited include Tehran, Persian Gulf (oil refinery and super tankers); Shiraz; Persepolis (palace of Darius the Great); and Isfahan (minaret, Shah's Mosque, bazaars, and miniature painting). Also filmed are carpet making; a Zurkhaneh "house of strength"; a 2,500th anniversary celebration staged by the Shah of Iran; passing through the "green belt" of the Caspian Sea area (villages, school, farms, caviar extraction from sturgeon); Turkoman tribesmen horse racing; the Royal Crown jewels; and Peacock Throne.

Captivating Ceylon: The Enchanted Island, 1975 2 Film reels (color silent: 3174 feet: 16mm)

Edited film is a travel-lecture film created by Karl E. Stein and documents travel in Ceylon (Sri Lanka) presenting how people live, work and play and their homes, schools and handicrafts. Locales visited include Colombo, the fortress palace of Sigiriya, Ratnapura (workers searching for rubies and sapphires), and Kandy (Esala Perahera festival). Also filmed are small fishing villages; coconut trees and the variety of uses; safari in a wildlife sanctuary, colossal statues; Sigiriya (fortress palace); fire walkers; and selecting tea and tea auction in the mountainous region.

Edited film is a travel-lecture film created by Karl E. Stein and documents travel in Thailand presenting how people live, work and play and their homes, schools and industries. Locales visited include Bangkok (traffic jams, King changing the robe on the Emerald Buddha in the Royal Chapel, and Klongs--floating markets on the canal); Ayutthaya (former court site for the Kings of Siam); Kanchanaburi; Chiang Mai (silk making); Phangna Bay; Phuket (rubber plantations); and Pattaya. Also filmed are temples (wats); Buddhist wedding; Chinese funeral; monastery; girls' dances; Thai boxers; and training young elephant for work in teak forests.

Locales visited include Seoul (palaces, wedding, markets, making lacquer furniture, fur coat manufacturing, and Olympic Games sports complex); Folk Village; Mt. Soraksan; Kyongu (former capital of the Silla Kingdom); Pomun Lake Resort; Pusan (auctioning of fish and United Nations' Cemetery; and Cheju Island.

Notes: Edited film is a travel-lecture film created by Karl E. Stein and documents documents travel in Taiwan presenting Chinese heritage interwoven with the modernization of the later twentieth century. Locales visited include Taipei (Sun Yat Sen, Chiang Kai-shek Memorials, and National Palace Museum); Sun Moon Lake; and Taroko Gorge. Also filmed are "aborigine tribes and their unique cultures" wildlife safari; orchids; Chinese cuisine; and shopping.
