1 Film reel (color sound; 324 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film documents growing, harvesting and handling of bananas including uses of bananas, a banana plantation and packaging and transporting of bananas.

Notes: Edited film shows ancient Egyptian history from 2700 B.C. to the Roman conquest. Portrayed are the religion and daily activities of the pharaohs and citizens. Shown are scenes of the building of the Aswan dam on the Nile.

1 Film reel (color sound; 396 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film shows Egyptian villagers and farmers in the Peruvian Andes working the land by hand and caring for cattle including milking and producing dairy products.

1 Film reel (color sound; 360 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film uses music and pictures of African carved masks and statues to portray the life of the peoples of west and central Africa and to reflect their fundamental fears and emotions.

Brazil: People of the Highlands, 1961

1 Film reel (color sound; 612 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film shows regional contrasts of Brazil, its coastal cities, coffee growing and the educational, religious and recreational activities of its peoples.

1 Film reel (color sound; 756 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film shows how the physical geography of England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland has influenced the character of the British people. Film also examines the chief activities of the British Isles.

Buddhist World, 1963

1 Film reel (color sound; 396 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film traces the historical and cultural growth of Buddhism; studies the life, work and philosophy of Gautama, Buddha and discusses the major tenets of Buddhism. Shown are scenes of India, Thailand, Japan and Tibet.

1 Film reel (color sound; 396 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film presents an overview of the six central American republics and British Honduras describing topographical regions in relationship to their climates and the effects on the inhabitants and their crops.

Boy of India: Rama and His Elephant, 1956

1 Film reel (color sound; 360 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film presents story of an Indian boy accompanying his father, a [mahout], to learn how to handle a work elephant.

Children of Scotland, 1958

1 Film reel (540 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film presents life in a fishing village on the eastern coast of Scotland. Scenes include bagpipe players, swirling kilts, home and school activities, fish market and shipbuilding.

Children of the Plains Indians, 1962

1 Film reel (color sound; 720 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film presents life on the Great Plains before the arrival of the settlers as seen through Red Cloud, an Indian boy, who describes village life, a festival, the setting up of summer camp, a buffalo hunt and other tribal activities.

Continent of Africa: Land Below the Sahara, 1963

1 Film reel (color sound; 792 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film presents an overview of Africa showing causes and effects of the many political and social revolutions, the contrasting ways of life of Africa's peoples, the physical geography of the continent and the importance of Africa to the world.

Eastern Europe: an Introduction, 1963

1 Film reel (color sound; 468 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film is an overview of the agriculture, industry, important cities, history and culture of Poland, Czechoslovakia, Yugoslavia, Bulgaria, Romania, Hungary and Albania.

Egypt: Cradle of Civilization, 1961

1 Film reel (color sound; 432 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film examines the culture of ancient Egypt and its contributions to the development of western civilization. Shown are how the Egyptian way of life evolved from a primitive tribal culture to an organized society under a single powerful ruler. Illustrated

are achievements in art, architecture, medicine, astronomy and mathematics.

1 Film reel (black-and-white sound; 612 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film presents an overview of West Germany from the Alpine region in the south with its small farms, craftsmen and shepherds to the plains region extending north and west and including the Rhineland Westphalia district, Europe's largest center of heavy industry.

1 Film reel (black-and-white sound; 612 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film focusses on the problem of bridging the gap between traditions found in Mayan Indian villages and life in the modern cities.

1 Film reel (color sound; 504 feet; 16mm)

1 Film reel (color sound; 720 feet; 16mm)

Film also looks at government, religion, education, recreation and current problems.

1 Film reel (color sound; 396 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film presents a general overview of the history, religions, customs and languages of Mexico, the West Indies and the countries of Central and South America. Film was distributed by Coronet Films.

Life In Northern Lands: Norway, 1954

1 Film reel (color sound; 396 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film follows a Norwegian farm family harvesting hay in the summer and fishing in the winter. Film was distributed by Coronet Films.

Life in the Alps, 1958

1 Film reel (color sound; 396 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film explains the daily activities of people living on the high slopes of the Austrian Alps and shows how farmers have developed a successful pattern of agriculture in alpine terrain. Film was distributed by Coronet Films.

Life in an Oasis: North Africa, 1962

1 Film reel (color sound; 360 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film describes importance of water and the oasis in the Egyptian Sahara. Film shows old and new methods of irrigating fields, surveyors and engineers looking for naturally occurring oases as well as sources of water underground and drilling for water. Film also depicts desert reclamation process and engineers planning for construction of what will be Aswan High Dam that was completed in 1971. Film was distributed by Coronet Films.

Life in Hot Rain Forests: Amazon Basin, 1961

1 Film reel (color sound; 504 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film explains the climatic factors that cause a tropical rain forest and shows how small communities of people adapt to this environment in the Amazon Basin. Depicted is a family tending their small garden, preparing their meals and gathering forest products for trade. Film was distributed by Coronet Films.

Life in Mediterranean Lands, 1963

1 Film reel (color sound; 396 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film pictures the peoples of the lands around the Mediterranean Sea, examines the geographic factors responsible for the sunny, mild climate and describes typical crops of the area.

Scenes of California are used to show similar climatic conditions throughout the world. Film was distributed by Coronet Films.

1 Film reel (color sound; 396 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film shows how life in high mountain regions is affected by altitude and climate and points out the importance of farming, grazing and weaving as well as the influences of the ancient Incan civilization. Film was distributed by Coronet Films.

1 Film reel (black-and-white sound; 540 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film using the device of a report from outer space to examine how ways of mankind might appear to visitors from another planet by considering the things most cultures have in common and the ways they change as they pass from one generation to the next.

1 Film reel (color sound; 828 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film explains the significance of the Mediterranean region in the development of western civilization and depicts life today in Greece, Italy, and the Arab countries stressing the importance of the region as a focal point of world tension. Distributed by Encyclopedia Britannica.

1 Film reel (color sound; 720 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film illustrates the contrasts between aristocrat and farmer, city and village, and old and new methods in industry and agriculture and traces cultural, religious and economic heritage of the Mexican people.

1 Film reel (color sound; 396 feet; 16mm)

Mexican Boy: the Story of Pablo, 1961

1 Film reel (color sound; 678 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film, produced and distributed for Encyclopedia Britannica Educational Films, tells story of a young Mexican boy and his family

who lives in an unidentified village in southeastern Mexico. The boy Pablo wants a pair of shiny new shoes to wear to the feast of the Virgin of Guadalupe. He does a variety of odd jobs to earn the money for the shoes but instead of buying the shoes he gives the money to his mother to pay for medicine for a sick sister. On the day of the feast, at the Shrine of the Virgin of Guadalupe in Mexico City, Pablo gets his shoes. Film includes scenes of a street market and daily activities in rural Mexican village, Pablo with his family in their adobe house, and Pablo and his father and brother herding cattle, picking beans and coffee, harvesting maguey and making adobe brick. Footage also includes scenes of Mexican countryside, outskirts of Mexico City and pilgrims at the Shrine of the Virgin of Guadalupe.

1 Film reel (color sound; 359 feet; 16mm)

Notes: Edited film, produced by Coronet Instructional Films, illustrates various craft making activities in smaller Mexican towns. Included are scenes of adobe tile and brick making; creating decorative tiles and pottery; sewing shoes in Cuernavaca, silversmithing in Tasco and laquerwork in Patzcuaro.

Notes: Edited film shows vacationing Parisian children emphasizing that children are the similar everywhere.
