Australia's Wild Nor'west, circa 1923

1 Videocassettes (VHS) (11 minutes; black-and-white silent; 1/2 inch)

Notes: Incomplete edited film of the 1917 North-West Scientific Expedition of Australia led by E.J. Stuart. Expedition explored the Australian coast between Broome and Wyndham and documented selective aspects of aboriginal peoples of coastal and inland Northern Territory. Footage includes demonstration of the use of the *Woomera* or throwing stick, a "War Corroboree" and examples of tribal scarification. Also included are scenes of coral reef and coastal wildlife, sea-eagles in nest, dugong capture, adult and hatchling sea turtles. Includes footage of aborigine "sounding" for turtles' eggs in sand and riding on the back of a sea turtle. Also includes National Geographic article and 1920 Australian film review.
