Klusmeier was a major in the military and this footage and at least some of the slides were shot in Vietnam, New Zealand, Hawaii, Hong Kong and Thailand. Film also includes some American locales.

Notes:

Footage was shot by Major P.D. Klusmeier who was in the military and traveled to southeast Asia, apparently primarily to Vietnam but also to Hawaii, Hong Kong and Thailand. Footage shot in Vietnam includes Valley of the Kings, street scenes in Saigon, Cho Lon area of Saigon, soccer game, aerial views, destroyed bridge; footage shot in Thailand includes visit to an unidentified indigenous village, Thai dancers and swim club; footage shot in Hong Kong includes a visit to the Tiger Balm Gardens, street scenes and a baseball game and footage shot in Hawaii includes cruise ship, hotel pool and hula dancingthe other countries includes the Tiger Balm gardens in Hong Kong.

Notes:

Footage was shot by Major P.D. Klusmeier who was in the military and, apparently, retired to Florida, probably Punta Gorda. Shots primarily include inside and outside houses, landscapes, a farm with cows, vehicles including cars, boats, golf cart, and ride-on mower, and moon landing television broadcast. Footage may also include Kansas City skyline, Missouri River trip on a boat, a bomber plant and a flood in Oklahoma (La Grange?) and La Grange train station.
