Biographical Note

Laura Thompson (1905-2000) conducted fieldwork in Oceania, the Southwestern United States and Europe; she taught at numerous institutions and served as a consultant for many organizations, including the Naval Government of Guam and the Office of Indian Affairs, throughout her career. Thompson's papers reflect her involvement in each of these activities as well as her desire to formulate a unifying theory of applied anthropology that would address issues including environmentalism and overpopulation.

Scope and Contents

The papers of Laura Thompson reflect the professional and personal life of an active and pioneering anthropologist. In the 1930s, Thompson began her work in applied anthropology, producing studies of Fiji, Guam and Hawaii intended to aid administrators of economic, educational and political development and pioneering approaches now known as "administrative" and "educational" anthropology. In the 1940s, Thompson applied her skills to the Indian Personality, Education and Administration Research Project, a study of eleven communities of five Native American tribes. From the 1950s until the end of her career, Thompson sought to formulate and demonstrate a theoretical anthropological synthesis of man and culture, while pursuing fieldwork in Iceland and Germany, teaching, and consulting for numerous institutions.

Included in this collection are field diaries, numerous manuscripts and lectures, research materials, correspondence, sound recordings and ethnographic photographs. Also included are various subject and index files maintained by Thompson for her many research projects. The collection is particularly rich in unpublished manuscripts that Thompson created from 1950 to the mid 1990s. Manuscript topics include particular field sites, such as Fiji and West Germany, as well as Thompson's critical and theoretical exposition regarding the future of applied anthropology, variously titled "Clinical" and "Holistic Anthropology."

Numerous materials pertaining to Thompson's personal life are also located in the collection, including personal diaries and professional awards, correspondence with friends and family, and personal photographs of Thompson from infancy to old age. Located in Thompson's personal papers are her writings from late in life, in which she addressed aging through her anthropological sensibilities, recorded formative memories from her youth, and projected the future of a world rife with injustice and environmental destruction. A large portion of the Laura Thompson papers include documents from the Indian Personality, Education and Administration (IPEA) Project, initiated by the Office of Indian Affairs and the University of Chicago Committee on Human Development. This investigation of five Native American tribes includes the results

of over 1000 psychological studies of native children. Materials included encompass the protocols for and implementation of the project, as well as field reports, psychological tests, correspondence, worker supervision reports and final analyses of findings. Included is a copy of the project's published final report, *Personality and Government* (1951). The bulk of the records date between 1941 and 47; related material spans as late as 1992. Correspondents primarily include project members and consultants, particularly: John Collier, A. I. Hallowell, Maud Hallowell, Royal Hassrick, Robert Havinghurst, Alice Joseph, Bruno Klopfer, Clyde Kluckhohn, Dorothea Leighton, D'Arcy McNickle, Trude Schmidl-Waehner, Heinrich Schultz, Ruth Underhill, and W. Lloyd Warner. The papers of the IPEA Project are restricted in use.

Scope and Contents: Thompson conducted fieldwork in Kambara, on Lau, Fiji from October 1933 to April 1934 with her first husband, Bernhard Tüting. This series includes incoming and outgoing correspondence, field notes, topical notebooks and manuscripts related to Thompson's investigations. Original manuscripts for Thompson's *Fijian Frontier* (1940) are not found in the collection. Correspondents include colleagues, grant-awarding institutions and publishing companies. Manuscript materials for Thompson's unpublished book, "Famine Isles," are filed in the order in which they were received. These materials also include correspondence with publishers and research notes directly related to the manuscript. Documents filed as "notes" include both field and research notes; most are undated, but they appear to have been compiled by Thompson as she synthesized the results of her field study. Photographs, which are located at the end of the series, consist primarily of fifty-four prints of twenty-eight different images, eleven of which were published in "Southern Lau, Fiji: An Ethnography" (1940). Many are stamped "credit to B.P. Bishop Museum," and it is presumed that all are from the Bishop Museum. For that reason, the NAA cannot grant reproduction permission.

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Series 2: GERMANY, 1934-1991

13 Inches

Scope and Contents: Between 1934 and 1937, Thompson lived in Germany with her husband, Bernhard Tuting, and his family. After returning to the United States in 1938, Thompson delivered lectures about life in Nazi Germany which are included in this series. Correspondence during this period includes letters from Thompson to her family; few outgoing letters are included. Annotations in pencil on these letters were added at a later date when Thompson edited the material for an intended book based upon her personal letters sent from the field. Manuscript versions of "Letters from Germany" are included with Thompson's Germany manuscripts. Original letters between 1934 and 1935 are absent from the collection. Thompson maintained her interest in German culture throughout her professional life. In 1952 and again in 1960, she returned to Germany to conduct the research which formed the basis for her book-length manuscript about Saxon values. Drafts for the book are filed alphabetically under the heading, "Saxony core values." Related values manuscripts may be found in Series 7. Manuscripts in this series also include papers that Thompson wrote in the 1940s but later edited and may have submitted for the Human Relations Area Files. Notes in this series include index reference files as well as research materials.

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Series 3: GUAM, 1938-1996

Scope and Contents: Invited by the island's Naval governor to evaluate the local educational system, Laura Thompson first conducted field research in Guam from 1938 to 1939. This study resulted in the publication of *Guam and its People* (1947). During her stay in Guam, Thompson also traveled to Asia; letters and materials from this trip are located in this series. Thompson maintained her interest in Guam, its administrative problems, and particularly the plights of the Chamorro people. She returned to the island a number of times in her career, including in 1977 and 1987, and maintained personal and professional relationships with colleagues and informants. Professional correspondence is both ingoing and outgoing; personal correspondence is almost entirely composed by Thompson. Correspondents include Thompson's family, colleagues, informants and Guamanian government officials. Thompson's letters to her family during her first trip to the field were later annotated for inclusion in a projected volume of letters from the field. Correspondents Becky Stephenson and her husband, Hiro Kurashina, were close friends as well as colleagues of Thompson's. They became Thompson's literary executors in the mid 1990s and some correspondence between Stephenson and Thompson relates to the publication of Thompson's autobiography, *Beyond the Dream*. Thompson's field studies include her itinerary, field notes, and an index to her field diary from 1938 and 1939, as well as notes she collected during her trip to the Orient. Few materials in the collection relate to Thompson's seminal work, *Guam and Its People*.

The Indian Personality, Education and Administration Research Project was supported jointly by the Office of Indian Affairs and the University of Chicago Committee on Human Development. Initiated in 1941 by Indian Affairs Commissioner John Collier, the study investigated eleven communities of five Native American tribes: Hopi, Navaho, Papago, and United Pueblos. The project studied Native Americans as both individuals and as tribal societies, with the aim of increasing the effectiveness of Indian Service policies and programs, improving Indian welfare and developing local autonomy. Thompson coordinated the project; at Chicago, the Indian Education Research Committee, headed by W. Lloyd Warner, was charged with the investigation's scientific work. When the University of Chicago withdrew from the program, they were replaced by the Society for Applied Anthropology. This series reflects much of the work of the IPEA project from its inception in 1941 through its termination in 1947; also included are materials that post-date the study as participants collaborated on investigational analyses. Materials are divided into the following subseries, based upon Thompson's original arrangement of the materials: general correspondence; subject file; interviews; Rorschach monograph; free drawing test; pilot study - Papago Reservation; Hopi materials; publications; and retrospective manuscripts and correspondence. All but the last subseries are restricted. See each subseries section for a description of contents.
