Related Materials

The National Anthropological Archives holds the [papers of Cherry Lowman](#) , Vayda's first wife, which document their fieldwork in Papua New Guinea and Lowman's subsequent doctoral work. Lowman and Vayda's papers both include mutual correspondence, field notes, and writings, so both collections should be consulted with respect to the Papua New Guinea research.

The National Anthropological Archives also holds the papers of a number of Vayda's research collaborators and correspondents, including the [Anthony Leeds papers](#) and the [Marvin Harris papers](#) .

The University of California San Diego's Tuzin archive for Melanesian Anthropology holds the Papua New Guinea field research documentation of Roy A. and Ann Rappaport.

Processing Information

The collection arrived at the archives in a semi-organized state. The archivist maintained original order of the materials where possible, but assigned the series organization to pull together natural groupings of material. Even so, there is overlap between the series; for instance, correspondence appears in most of the series, and there are related or similar files between the Research and Writings series. Some of the folders lacked clear identification so some related material may have been organized into separate series.

Biographical Note

Andrew P. "Pete" Vayda was an anthropologist and ecologist who founded the Department of Human Ecology at Rutgers University, and throughout his long career conducted field work in the Cook Islands, Papua New Guinea, and Indonesia. Long standing concerns were interaction between people and the environment, and issues in anthropological methodology and causal explanation.

Born in Budapest, Hungary in 1931, Vayda came to the United States in 1939 with his mother, settling in New York City. Vayda attended Columbia University for both undergraduate and graduate degrees, earning his PhD in 1956.

Vayda's dissertation fieldwork was archival, and he spent 1954-1955 in New Zealand libraries conducting research on Maori warfare. His dissertation was published as *Maori Warfare* (1960), now considered a classic and an authoritative work on Maori Warfare prior to it being altered by European influences.

Vayda spent 1956-1957 in the coral atolls of the Cook Islands. This work did not result in a major monograph but several articles ensued, including "Love in Polynesian Atolls" (1961).

From 1958-1960, Vayda was employed as a lecturer at the University of British Columbia, and in 1960 he joined the anthropology faculty at Columbia University.

From 1961-1967 Vayda's social and ecological field studies centered on the Maring people of Papua New Guinea. Following the award of a 1961 NSF research grant for the project "Culture and Environment in the New Guinea Rainforest," Vayda and his student assistants Roy and Ann Rappaport, Cherry Lowman (Vayda), and Allison and Marek Jablonko conducted field work among the Maring people in the Simbai valley of the western New Guinea highlands. Initial fieldwork was finished in 1963, however Vayda and Cherry returned in 1966 to continue studies in the Jimi Valley, neighboring the Simbai Valley.

In 1972, Vayda moved to Rutgers University, where he founded the Department of Human Ecology. Also in 1972, Vayda founded the Journal *Human Ecology*, and was on the editorial boards for other journals over the years including *Anthropological Theory*, *American Anthropologist*, and *Advances in Human Ecology*.

In the 1970s and 1980s Vayda became involved with research in Indonesia through UNESCO's Man and Biosphere Program, where he directed or co-directed interdisciplinary projects on the causes of deforestation in East Kalimantan, Borneo. Other Indonesia projects looked at causes of forest and peat fires, integrated pest management, and relocation of settlers from a national park. Vayda was a senior research associate of the Center for International Forestry Research (CIFOR), as well as an adjunct professor at the University of Indonesia in Bogor, and Monash University in Melbourne, Australia.

Vayda's Indonesia research was also notable for his conceptual and methodological innovations. Breaking with anthropological tradition of conducting holistic studies of communities or societies within which the activities of interest occurred, the projects concentrated on explaining the activities by relating them to the specific contexts in which they were occurring and by making the contexts themselves the objects of research to make them broader or denser in explanation-relevant ways. The methodology, as set forth in Vayda's article, "Progressive Contextualization; Methods for Research in Human Ecology," (1983) has been adopted by many anthropologists and others doing applied research.

Vayda's long and varied career is evident through hundreds of articles, books, and other publications. Vayda retired in 2002 from Rutgers. He died on January 15, 2022, in New York City.

Content Description

The papers of Andrew P. Vayda document his research interests in ecological anthropology as well as his concerns and critiques about anthropological methods. The papers comprise correspondence, field notes, writings, photographs, sound recordings, and other documents from the 1950s through the 2010s, providing an overview of his career and reflecting the evolution of his thinking.

The bulk of the collection consists of correspondence, research documentation, and writings. To a lesser degree, professional activities, teaching, and Vayda's own education are documented. Also included is a small set of papers of Vayda's former wife and colleague Cherry Lowman.

Regarding Vayda's research in Papua new Guinea, researchers are encouraged to also consult the papers of Cherry Lowman (held by the National Anthropological Archives) as there is much overlap and shared notes; for instance the bulk of the photographs from that trip are in Lowman's papers, while sound recordings are in Vayda's papers.

Please note that the contents of the collection and the language and terminology used reflect the context and culture of the time of its creation. As an historical document, its contents may be at odds with contemporary views and terminology and considered offensive today. 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Series 2: Correspondence

Scope and Contents: Series 2, "Correspondence" comprises both incoming letters as well as Vayda's carbon copies of outgoing letters. Vayda's alphabetical arrangement has been maintained, with letters arranged by last name of correspondent but also by subject. Several files relating to Cook Islands and Papua New Guinea research at the end of the series are chronological. Additional correspondence can be found throughout the collection within other series, and sometimes related correspondence can be found in both correspondence as well as other series such as research and writings. Correspondence with Cherry Lowman can be found in Series 7. Of note is Vayda's correspondence with Roy Rappaport, spanning the 1960s-1990s and containing extensive communications throughout their field research in Papua New Guinea.

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Series 3: Research

Scope and Contents: Series 3, "Research" consists of Vayda's field notes and diaries, research data, grant proposals and reports, some correspondence, and reference material used in research. Arrangement is, for the most part, chronological.

Vayda made carbon copies of most of his handwritten and typed field notes, and kept them in varying organization so both originals and carbons have been kept. The bulk of the field notes are from Vayda's Cook Islands research and his Papua New Guinea research. The Papua New Guinea field notes also are indexed by subject.

Vayda's Indonesia research subseries does not contain the kinds of systematic field notes made during his earlier research, so much of what is in this subseries are project files with correspondence, proposals, reports, and other documentation.

The "Other research" subseries is a somewhat catch-all for research and projects that fell outside of the main subseries, and contains proposals, field notes from a Malaysia trip, symposia papers and correspondence, and various other notes and documentation.

Maori warfare

Scope and Contents: Subseries: "Maori Warfare" comprises materials relating to Vayda's dissertation fieldwork conducted at the University of Auckland which resulted in the book *Maori Warfare*. Included are drafts, correspondence, reviews, and source material from Vayda's extensive archival research.

Papua New Guinea

Scope and Contents: Subseries: "Papua New Guinea" comprises Vayda's research materials from his work among the Maring people of Papua New Guinea. Included are NSF grant proposals, correspondence,

and reports for several related research projects, beginning with the first project, "Culture and Environment in the New Guinea Rainforest" which saw Vayda and his student assistants Cherry Lowman Vayda, Ann and Roy Rappaport, and Allison and Marek Jablonko conduct groundbreaking fieldwork among the Maring of the Simbai Valley in the western highlands in 1962-1963. Of note among these files is a notebook kept by Margaret Mead with correspondence, administrative notes, and other material relating to this field research.

The bulk of this subseries consists of field notes and diaries from both the initial research as well as the Vayda's follow up research in 1966 he and Cherry Lowman worked with the Maring of the Jimi Valley which neighbored Simbai. Additional material in this subseries includes survey and other data, patrol reports, correspondence, and subject files.

Sound recordings and photographs from this research can be found in series 8 and 9, and series 2 series contains extensive communication about the research or with other members of the research team. Draft and published articles from this research is in the Writings series.

Researchers interested in the Papua New Guinea research should also consult the papers of Cherry Lowman held by the National Anthropological Archives as there is much overlap in field notes and other research data, photographs, and correspondence.
