The papers were retrieved from disposal by a neighbor of the Hilder family in Arlington, VA, who gave them to the Arlington Historical Society. The historical society then donated the collection to the NAA in 2024.

Biographical

Frank Frederick Hilder was born in Hastings, England, in 1826. He joined the British Army as a young man, and was immediately sent to India where he saw action during the Indian uprising of 1857. Hilder traveled widely during his service, traversing India, Indonesia, Borneo, the Philippines, and also Africa, all the while learning about the ethnology and geography of the various lands. After distinguishing himself as a military expert in Egypt, he was promoted to the rank of Colonel at the request of the Khedive. His tenure in the Egyptian army was not long-lived,

however, as his eyesight was seriously injured in a sandstorm. He left the Military because of the injury, and came to the United States, where he continued to recover.

In the 1860s Hilder went to work for Remington Arms, representing the company internationally in Central and South America. He later established businesses dealing in small arms in Chicago and lumber in Mississippi City, and conducted archaeological research in the Mississippi Valley. Hilder served as secretary of the National Geographical Society in 1898-1899, and was hired to do translation work for the Bureau of American Ethnology around that time. In 1900 Hilder was sent to the Philippines to collect ethnologic materials for the 1901 Pan-American Exposition at Buffalo.

Hilder married Mary Anne Duckworth in 1850. Following her death in 1863, Hilder then married Jane Willard Croswell. Hilder died on January 21, 1901 in Washington D.C.

Content Description

The Frank F. Hilder papers consist of a small set of largely miscellaneous papers. Though somewhat random, the correspondence, various business and real estate papers, ephemera, newspaper clippings, publications, and photographs help to illustrate the life of Hilder in his later years. Contents provide glimpses into hilder's activities including business dealings through written agreements, society membership letters, and newspaper clippings, as well as through lecture notices, business cards, ephemera, and correspondence.

Correspondence includes letters to Hilder's second wife Jane W. Hilder, as well as the father of Hilder's first wife, Caleb Croswell.

Ephemera includes a wide variety of materials to include Mardi Gras Krewe invitations and a set of Philippine revolutionary propaganda pamphlets.

Photographs include colored albumen prints from from Japan and possibly Egypt, photos of Hilder and others on shipboard, as well as a number of unidentified prints.
