Biographical / Historical

Robert T. "Smitty" Smith was stationed in the Pacific in WWII at Guadalcanal, Bougainville (Piva-Torokina), and New Guinea in 1943-1944. He stayed after the end of the war in New Guinea working to recover the remains of downed aircraft crews. and became fluent in Tok Pisin.

Scope and Contents

The collection primarily relates to Smith's time in New Guinea. It includes sketches of people and the natural environment, watercolors, one framed painting, photographs, hand and type-written folktales, and letters including correspondence with Dr. C.A. Schmitz. Much of the written material is in Tok Pisin.
